

The entire pipe is full of liquid with density ρ, and the left end of the pipe is at an atmospheric pressure Po. A small open tube extends upwards from the lower pipe. Find the height h2 of the liquid in the small tube when:

(a) the right end of the lower pipe is closed, so that the liquid is in a hydrostatic equilibrium. (2 points)



Problem 3

The position vs. time graph of a particle is shown in the figure. Determine

(a) the angular frequency of the motion. (1 point) $\omega = \frac{2T}{T} = \frac{2T}{8} = \left[\frac{T}{4} \right] \frac{rad}{S}$



(b) the phase constant φ of the motion. (2 points)

$$X(t) = 0.10 \text{ m cos}(\frac{\pi}{4}t + \varphi)$$

 $X(0) = 0.05 \text{ m} = 0.10 \text{ m cos}(\varphi)$
 $Cos(\varphi) = \frac{0.05}{0.10} = \frac{1}{2} \qquad \varphi = cos^{2}(\frac{1}{2}) = \frac{1}{2}$

(c) the velocity of the particle at t = 1.0 s (3 points)

$$X(t) = 0.1 \times Cos(\frac{\pi}{4}t - \frac{\pi}{3})$$

$$V(t) = -(0.1 \times \frac{\pi}{4}) \times sin(\frac{\pi}{4}t - \frac{\pi}{3})$$

$$V(1) = -\frac{\pi}{40} \times sin(\frac{\pi}{4} - \frac{\pi}{3}) \quad m/s$$

$$= \frac{1 + 0.02}{1 + 0.02} \quad m/s$$

Problem 4

A 0.10 kg ball, attached to a spring with spring constant 2.5 N/m, oscillates horizontally on a frictionless surface. When the ball is 0.05m from the equilibrium position its velocity is 0.2 m/s

(a) What is the total energy of the ball-spring system? (2 points)

$$E = \frac{1}{2} k x^{2} + \frac{1}{2} m v^{2}$$

$$= \frac{1}{2} x 2.5 x (0.05)^{2} + \frac{1}{2} x 0.1 x (0.2)^{2} = \boxed{0.0051 \text{ J}}$$

(b) What is the amplitude of oscillations? (2 points)

$$E = \frac{1}{2}kA^{2}$$

$$A = \sqrt{\frac{2E}{K}} = \sqrt{0.064 \text{ m}}$$

(c) What is the speed of the ball when it is at x = 0.06 m from the equilibrium point? (2 points)

$$E = \frac{1}{2} k x^{2} + \frac{1}{2} m V^{2}$$

$$V = \sqrt{\frac{2E}{m} - \frac{k}{m} x^{2}}$$

$$= \sqrt{\frac{2 \times 0.0051}{0.1} - \frac{2.5}{0.1} \times (0.06)^{2}} = \sqrt{0.11 \frac{m}{s}}$$
